





South West Surrey Local Valuing People Group Minutes

Presentation on Support Volunteering by Surrey Choices





Lydia came to speak about the vocational projects at Surrey Choices.

Surrey Choices vocational project works with a wide range of people in Surrey. They help people to find employment or support people to take up volunteering.




Volunteering is about giving back time to a charity, an organisation or a group of people without expecting money back.



The Vocational Project does this by arranging one staff member for a group of 3 or 4 individuals. This works like a buddying system. They get involved with an activity outdoors or a volunteering opportunity.







Some of these including doing countryside management tasks, clearing public footpaths, work on farms, meadows, nature reserves, community allotments, cafes, church cafes, Libraries, charity shop and community fridge



Volunteering gives you the opportunity to try new things, meeting people and giving people confidence and independence.

Rebecca said she was interested in helping with making things better at Frimley Park.




Action: Emily and Rebecca to get in contact to discuss vocational projects options with Lydia.



Emma asked if there was eligibility of who can join or not join this?



Lydia said most people who join would need to be funded by adult social care or self-fund. If people do want to join, they would like to know what they want to do and learn. Lydia said they are happy for people to contact them directly





Lydia said they have 6
different teams. They have
teams in Staines, Camberley,
Woking, Redhill and their
Wave Podcasting service
which covers all over Surrey.



Rebecca asked whether it was possible to fit some of the activities to suit the residence at Whitmore Vale. Could they cover Travel training or working with Machinery?



Lydia said if there are people interested in woodwork, Machinery and how to fix things, they are quite a lot of the repair cafes and men in sheds groups that are quite welcoming.



Ian asked if someone brings their own supporter and carer with them, are they allowed to stay and help?

Lydia suggested if a carer wants to join, a volunteer group is a better option for them. Majority are quite open to carers joining.

Volunteering at Whitmore Vale



Rebecca spoke about their volunteering journey at Whitmore Vale which they have started

Key Points



- Whitmore Vale support people with care and support needs, which they do well. But there is lots more they want to do. They want to work on trying to achieve goals of the people they support.
 - They are looking at person-centred planning, which helps to achieve dreams and goals



They are looking for volunteers who can support them on these personal goals. They have put job adverts out to try and recruit for this role. They have now recruited one person for this, but recruiting for more people.



Rebecca asked the group if you can a volunteer just for you what would you like to do? There was discussion about Whitmore Vale about what people wanted to do.











Lydia suggested borrow my doggy might be a good idea if people are interested in this.


John said someone to help him go running. Park Run may be a good option for him.

David wants to get involved with Swimming. Go to the Gym to get more exercise.


Phillip says he is travel trained so he could help others.

Active Buddies at Surrey Coalition



Katy came to speak about the Get More Active Project. It is a project to help those with a disability to get more active.



Katy spoke about why it was important to be healthy and to exercise.

Katy spoke about how the get more active project can help you decide what activities you would like to do, what activities are nearby to where you live and setting your own personal goals.

The Get More Active project can help by, doing a monthly meet up to try different activities.



A buddy will be allocated for you to go to activities with you, to travel with you to your activity. Your buddy will support you and give you the confidence whilst being active.

Katie said they are trying to recruit more buddies at the moment.

There has been incidents where those who are visual impaired get off the bus and walk into the cycle lane without knowing. It is very dangerous.

Friendly Communities event which
