





Northwest Surrey Local Valuing People Group Minutes

Welcome and Introductions

Safe Places









Amanda and Carinder attended a Learning Disability England Webinar online.

At the meeting, there was a discussion about Community Employment. People spoke about how they did not feel safe in their community.



Hate Crime Prevention at Future Directions CIC

Amanda shared a video future directions SPICE (Supporting People into Community Employment) video about Hate Crime Awareness. The people in the video, got money from the local council to set up their own Safe Place scheme.

It is a National scheme where if you felt unsafe, you can go to shop, office, café or public building such a library or leisure centre for help or somewhere you feel safe.





In Surrey, there is a Safe Places scheme in Guildford.



Organisations can apply to start their own scheme in an area.

To run a scheme, you need funding to be part of the scheme website and app.

Some places get people with learning disabilities and autism to get involved with it. It is a great employment opportunity for people too.


Amanda and Carinder felt it was important to share this information.

It is important for people to have a safe place if their feel scared or worried.

Not everyone feels comfortable speaking out when they are not happy or worried about people not understanding what they are saying.

















Carla mentioned about the Purple Angel scheme which is for people with Dementia, which is a very similar scheme to Safer Places.

Miriam said she will have a look and see whether there may be a way of getting funding for a scheme in Woking.

Community Link Officers







Miriam is a Community Link Officer for Woking. There is one in each borough or district across Surrey.

Sherewater and Goldsworth Park have been found as key neighbourhoods in her area of Surrey, and she focuses on them.

We watched a film about <u>community link officers</u>.



You will find Miriam at plenty of local community events.



Community Link Officers do a lot of sign posting for people and existing groups within the community.



They help to find funding or venues for people and groups. They are always based in the community and work to link people up.



Miriam provided contact details for the local community link officers for the north west area.





Carinder wanted to know who was covering the Walton on Thames areas and what areas do Community Link Officers (CLO) cover?

Miriam shared details of the local CLO's for the local area. In each area, the CLO's would have a good knowledge of each areas.

Helen said it was important that there is a balance to make sure services are accessible for the right people.





Miriam says they makes sure they do safety checks and barriers to make sure that activity or service is accessible for the right groups.





Carinder asked whether they would they support people to find work.

Miriam said they can help link people to organisations who could support with that or find voluntary opportunities.






Georgia is a local area coordinator (LAC) and covers Maybury and Sheerwater.



They do a lot of goal setting and working with people's strengths and skills and working 1:1 with residents.



There is no age restrictions. They work alongside people to help them to achieve their goals.
